TAX EXTENSION 2014 PAYABLE 2015

Kane County Clerk, John A Cunningham certified the Kane County Tax Extension to the Kane County Treasurer on April 1, 2015. The total money extended for 2014 was \$1,247,311,574.70 for all taxing districts in Kane County. The total equalized assessed value of the property in the county was \$11,636,828,911. There are a total of 192,856 parcels in the County. The total of new property is \$101,022,553; up 1.24% from 2013 payable 2014. There are 160,121 exemptions granted. 69.1% of property tax money goes to Schools. Kane County itself did hold its property tax levy flat as compared to last year. Don't wait til' the last minute!

If you are traveling outside the United States on summer vacation a passport is required. You can apply for a passport at the Kane County Clerk's office. Average turn around time for a passport is 4 to 6 weeks. You may expedite for an extra charge bringing the turn around time to 3 weeks.

Items required for a passport to be processed at the Kane County Clerk's office:

- Certified birth certificate (must be a State of Illinois issued abstract with parent's name(s) on it if a Kane County birth!) If you have questions contact us at 630/232-5964.
- Check or Money Order for the Passport Fee. No cash accepted for the Passport Agency.
- Passport sized photos.
- Driver's License or State issued ID if age 16 or older.

SUMMER WEDDING PLANS IN YOUR FUTURE??



If you and your fiancé are getting married in Kane County within 60 days, you and your fiancé need to visit our office and apply for a marriage license. You need to apply for the license before you get married. Please be sure that the location where you are going to have your ceremony is in Kane County. The application process takes about 20-25 minutes. When you leave our office you will have the proper paperwork to present to your officiant to be married in Kane County.

Requirements for a marriage license are:

You must be at least 18 years of age (16 & 17 must call our office for special instructions)

You both must bring valid government issued photo ID, such as a driver's license, state ID, passport, or Matricula.

ID's must be valid, expired ID's are not acceptable.

\$32.00 IN CASH per couple.

The license is valid for 60 days, so in other words your ceremony must take place within that time period. You do not want to apply any sooner than 60 days prior.

There is a one day waiting period, so the license is valid the following day after you apply.

You may be married through the court, by a member of the clergy or a retired judge.

2015 Statement of Economic Interest Filing

The 2015 Statement of Economic Interests filing period has begun. The online notification as well as paper statements was sent out to the filers on March 23, 2015. If the filer received an online notification via email, then they can file through our online system which is accessible at www.kanecountyclerk.org file their statement and receive a filing receipt sent directly to their email.

If the filer received a paper statement, then they can return the statement either by mail or by walking it into our office, and you will be provided a filing receipt.

All statements are due no later than May 1, 2015. Any statements received after that date will incur a \$15.00 late fee per the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act 5 ILCS 420/.

2015 CONSOLIDATED ELECTIONS

February 24, 2015 Consolidated Primary

The Kane County Clerk's Elections Department successfully administered the Consolidated Primary for the Village of Campton Hills.

April 7, 2015 Consolidated Election

In the 2015 Consolidated Election the following districts officers were elected: Municipal, Ward, Village, Township, Park, Library, School, Community College, Fire Protection and other Special Districts. On the April 7, 2015 ballot we had seven referenda for: Burlington Fire, Blackberry Township Road, St. Charles Park, Village of Gilberts, Fox River Fire, and the Aurora West School District Proposition. The Kane County Election Authority once again conducted a very successful election.

BE PREPARED! REGISTER TO VOTE

Voter registration opened April 9th. A person can register to vote by mail or in person. You must provide 2 acceptable forms of ID when registering. Registering by mail requires the completion of the mail in registration form provided on the Kane County Clerk's web page and two acceptable forms of ID.

Information on Acceptable forms of ID's (Public Act 83-0258) can be found on our website, www.kanecountyelections.org.

To be eligible to vote you must be a US citizen, be **18 years old** by the next General Election, November 8, 2016 and have resided in the precinct for **30 days** prior to the next election.

Voters who have changed their name since registering to vote must re-register to vote. **Grace Period** registration is for persons who missed the deadline to register to vote. During Grace Period registration you may register to vote at the Kane County Clerk's office from the 27th day through the 3rd day prior to the election. If you register to vote during grace period and want to vote in the upcoming election, you **MUST** vote at the time of registration.
